Background

The Association of Fundraising Professionals Chicago Chapter (AFP Chicago) sponsors an annual awards program to recognize the outstanding achievements of individual, foundation and corporate philanthropists, fundraising volunteers, and professional fundraising executives. AFP Chicago is pleased to honor individuals who demonstrate high ethical standards and exemplify the philanthropic spirit of our great city.

Selection Process

Completeness of information is essential for consideration. Honorees will be selected by the Awards Committee comprised of representatives from nonprofit organizations of all sizes from throughout the Chicago area. Because of the number of applications submitted, it is not possible to accept late nominations. **Nominators must be a current AFP Chicago chapter member. If they are not a member, the nomination must be endorsed by a current AFP Chicago chapter member.**

Presentation of Awards

The honorees selected will receive their awards at the 35th Annual Philanthropy Awards Luncheon May 20, 2011. Honorees will be notified of their selection by December 1, 2010. Honorees must be present to receive awards. AFP Philanthropy Awards are not bestowed posthumously.

Nominations must consist of four sections. Please use the following checklist to ensure that you have included all of the essential information:

- A letter on standard (8½" x 11") paper explaining why the nominee should be honored for the award. Cite specific examples of the nominee's fulfillment of the award category criteria.
- A copy of the nominee's current resume.
- Supporting materials that may include a list of achievements, copies of articles or reports, and/or biography. Videos are not accepted.
- Three letters of support from individuals or organizations that strengthen the nomination. These should explain accomplishments that specifically support the award category definition.
- The completed Nomination Form Checklist.

Please note: Nominations must be no more than ten pages in length, including this form and checklist.

Kindly remove all staples from nomination packet prior to submitting.

AWARD CATEGORIES (✓ one):

- Distinguished Philanthropist Award:** Presented to an individual or family that has generously donated from personal resources to a variety of philanthropic causes.
- Executive Leader Award:** Presented to a corporate executive whose outstanding leadership has garnered business and civic support for philanthropy. *The leader does not have to be the CEO of the corporation.*
- Professional Grantor Award:** Presented to a corporate or foundation giving officer recognized for his/her professionalism, sensitivity and generous support to the nonprofit community. *This is generally a paid staff position in a grant making organization.*
- Outstanding Community Leader Award:** Presented to an individual who has shown extraordinary leadership and advocacy for a cause that has resulted in significant and positive change for a particular neighborhood, issue or segment of our community.
- Outstanding Volunteer Award:** Presented to an individual who demonstrated exemplary volunteerism through the dedication of significant personal time, talents, and resources fostering a particular organization or group of organizations.

Benjamin Franklin Award: Presented to a fundraising professional who has attained significant achievements in a long career and is looked to by the profession as a role model. *This is generally a person with ten or more years experience in fundraising that has contributed to the field as a professional, trainer/mentor, and/or volunteer. Nominees do not have to be members of AFP Chicago. Individuals who have won the President's Award may be considered for the Benjamin Franklin Award.*

President's Award: Presented to a fundraising professional who has demonstrated outstanding leadership and service to the AFP Chicago Chapter. *This is awarded to a paid fundraiser or fundraising consultant that abides by the AFP code of ethics and has served the AFP Chicago Chapter on at least three different committees or for a minimum of three years. Nomination should include a list of chapter accomplishments. Individuals who have won the Benjamin Franklin Award may be nominated for the President's Award, if applicable. Nominees must be members of AFP Chicago.*

Outstanding Youth in Philanthropy Award: Presented to a high school or college youth leader or a youth-generated project and its team that has significantly impacted the Chicago community. The recipient(s) will have demonstrated the philanthropic tradition and values associated with serving the community.
