## **2011 Chicago Fellows Program Program Description and Call for Nominees**

The Chicago Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP) is delighted to announce a call for nominees for the **2011 AFP Chicago Fellows Program**.

**Applications for this program are due at the AFP Chicago Chapter office on Friday, November 12, 2010.**

### **Purpose**

AFP Chicago's objective is to offer our educational resources and the collective professional expertise of our membership – in accessible and user-friendly formats – to assist individuals in building communities through philanthropy as well as building professional fundraising skills.

The **Fellows Program** is an outreach initiative of the AFP Chicago Chapter created to build awareness of these resources, particularly to those individuals who have been in the profession for three years or less and might otherwise not have the opportunity or resources to take advantage of its services.

This program is offered to any individuals working with or for nonprofit organizations in metropolitan Chicago, with an emphatic interest in people of color and/or Gay/Lesbian/Bisexual/Transgender/Questioning (GLBTQ). Individuals from grassroots organizations are strongly encouraged to apply.

### **Benefits and Expectations of Participation**

Regular attendance is expected in this one-year program that will provide the following benefits to the selected Fellows:

- Complimentary 2011 AFP International and AFP Chicago Chapter memberships;
- Complimentary registration for quarterly AFP Chicago educational luncheon programs on a variety of philanthropic topics;
- Complimentary registration fee for the Midwest Conference on Philanthropy, held in Chicago; and
- Senior development professional assigned as a mentor upon graduation from the program.

## **Eligibility Criteria**

- Be responsible for fundraising in a metropolitan Chicago area 501 (c)(3) organization;
- Have the full support of their supervisor and their organization's leadership to participate in this educational program;
- Be available to attend the programs and events comprising the Fellows curriculum;
- Not currently be a member of AFP, and continue paid membership in AFP for at least one year after the conclusion of the Fellows Program.
- Preferred but not required – Identify themselves as an ethnic minority/GLBTQ/Disabled and/or work for an organization that represents that community.

To apply, candidates should submit the attached application form by **Friday, November 12, 2010**.

Please note that if you are selected as an AFP Chicago Fellow, you or your organization will be required to provide a \$100 non-refundable annual enrollment fee. You/your organization will also agree to pay your 2012 Associate Membership fee upon completion of the 2011 program.

Applications will be reviewed by a selection committee and candidates chosen to be Fellows will be notified in writing by November 19, 2010, and introduced to the membership December 3, 2010. Fellows selected will need to be available to attend the December 3 educational luncheon program at Athena's Greek Restaurant.

The Fellows Program will commence in January 2011. A detailed calendar will be provided and regular attendance is expected.
