

Adam Davis Biography

Adam Davis is currently the board president of Camp of Dreams, a non-profit organization providing year-round programming for underserved young people in Chicago. He is also Senior Research and Teaching Associate for the Project on Civic Reflection, in which capacity he has trained hundreds of facilitators to lead community and workplace discussions around the country. Davis is also the founder and lead facilitator of "Justice Talking," a national program for service and volunteer organizations; an instructor in The Odyssey Project, a college-level humanities program for low-income adults in Chicago; and the coeditor of *The Civically Engaged Reader*, *Hearing the Call across Traditions: Readings on Faith and Service* and *Talking Service: Readings for Reflection*. Davis has written for *The Common Review* and *The Chicago Tribune*, and he used to lead wilderness trail crews for the United States Forest Service.

Davis received his Ph.D. from the University of Chicago, his M.A. from Boston College and his B.A. from Kenyon College.
