Dear AFP Colleague,

The Nominating Committee of AFP – Chicago Chapter invites nominations for the Board of Directors with terms beginning January 1, 2009. Please take a few minutes to review the attached document which describes Board member selection criteria and responsibilities and give thought to nominating an outstanding individual for Board service.

Effective November 14, 2008, Directors are elected to one year terms and may serve a lifetime maximum of eight terms. Current Directors who want to be considered for re-election to an additional one-year term must nominate themselves by submitting a completed Call of Nominations form (see attached).

Because the Chapter is strongly committed to diversity, we especially encourage you to think about Board nominees who are diverse in their cultures and lifestyles and/or who are employed in all types and sizes of organizations as well as those that serve a cross-section of Chicago's diverse communities.

Finally, we encourage you to evaluate your personal competencies and interests and nominate yourself if you are so interested. Before nominating someone other than yourself, we ask that you seek that person's agreement to be nominated and ask him/her to provide a comprehensive written summary of her/his prior service to AFP Chicago.

The Nominating Committee will review all nominations in accordance with the criteria that have been established for Board service (see attached), and a slate of nominees will be presented to Chapter members for election in November.

Strong leadership is a hallmark of the AFP Chicago Chapter and we seek highly qualified and highly committed members for service on the Board of Directors. We appreciate your participation in identifying outstanding professionals for this rewarding volunteer experience. If you have any questions, please feel free to contact either of us.

# RESPONSIBILITIES AND CRITERIA FOR AFP CHICAGO CHAPTER BOARD MEMBERS

## Responsibilities

Members of the Board of Directors of the Chicago Chapter of AFP make the policies for the Chapter and monitor the execution of those policies. The Board determines its present and future direction including: general and specific policies, long-range planning, management and augmentation of finances, personnel policy, and working relationship with the staff.

In addition, individual board members are asked:

- A. To attend all required board and/or committee meetings appropriate to this position.
- B. To be prepared for meetings and to lead/participate in discussions thoughtfully and responsibly.
- C. To complete and submit on a timely basis all chapter reports appropriate to this position.
- D. To support the majority decision on issues decided by the Board of Directors.
- E. To sign the *Conflict of Interest Statement* and uphold its beliefs and values.
- F. To know and promote understanding of the mission and purposes of the Chapter.
- G. To act responsibly in establishing Chapter policies.
- H. To participate in the annual review of the Board of Directors and Chapter activities.
- I. To maintain the Chapter on a sound financial basis and to exercise a strong sense of fiduciary responsibility on behalf of the Chapter.
- J. To lead/participate in annual planning, budgeting and leadership orientation activities.
- K. To either have attained a CFRE status or to do so within 18 months of becoming a board member (or becoming eligible). Once achieved, to renew – CFRE status regularly.
- L. To support the efforts of the officers and chairs by actions such as:
  - thoughtfully reviewing committee recommendations and materials presented to the board;
  - encouraging fundraising professionals to join AFP;
  - registering whenever possible for Chapter programs and events;
  - encouraging member and nonmember participation in Chapter programs;
  - making Chapter program attendees feel welcome; and
  - making nominations for Chapter awards.
- M. To ensure that all activities are in adherence with the Chapter's bylaws, policies and procedures.
- N. To maintain active AFP membership.
- O. To annually support the AFP Foundation for Philanthropy with a gift.
- P. To promote understanding of the significance of philanthropy.
- Q. To be proud of this profession – a Board member's personal presentation should always be that of a fundraising *professional*.

## Criteria

Individuals who demonstrate ability and commitment to AFP are logical candidates for membership on the Board of Directors. Board Members should be selected with specific criteria in mind, among which the following should be considered minimum prerequisites. They must:

- A. be a Chicago Chapter member for at least two (2) years;
- B. have actively participated on at least two (2) committees or the equivalent (i.e. committee service in another AFP chapter);
- C. have their CFRE or must become certified within 18 months of being elected to the Board.

In addition:

- D. Without quotas, candidates should be selected with concern for balance which reflects the Chapter itself in the following areas:
  - 1. development background
  - 2. field of expertise (other than development, e.g. management, finance, etc.)
  - 3. geographical distribution (e.g. city, suburban)
  - 4. gender
  - 5. minorities
  - 6. organizational representation (e.g. arts, social services, education, etc.)
