In addition, Morgan serves as the SVP of Education for the Chicago Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals (AFP), a vibrant 850-member chapter that recently went through a strategic planning process. She serves as a member of the Executive Committee and leads efforts in 2017 to rework and rebrand educational opportunities for fundraising professionals in and around the Chicago area.
